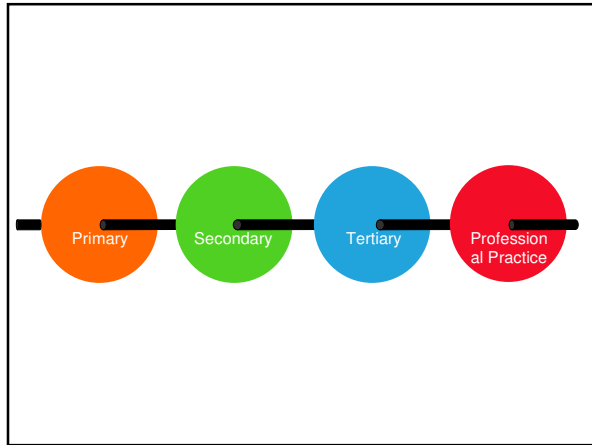

**Towards a further model**

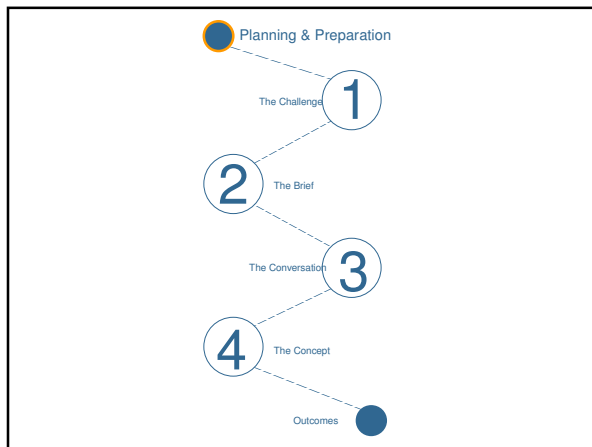
The Young Design programme replicates the joinedupdesignforschools model, but involves students of design and architecture instead of established professionals.

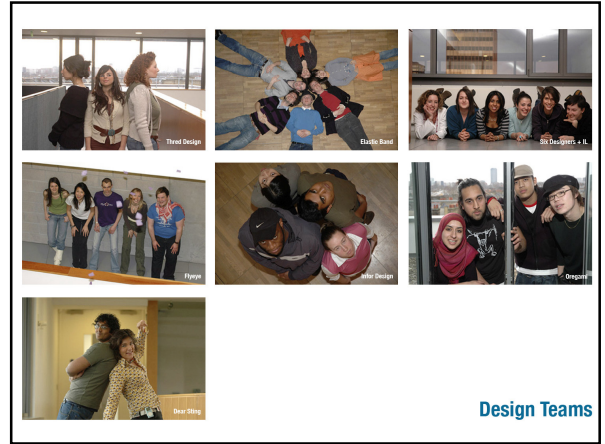
The programme pioneers a model to join up primary, secondary and tertiary education with professional practice.

In year one, 2005 - 2006, 45 students from the University of the Arts, London, worked in design teams with 10 London schools. The students were mentored by professional practitioners. (*Eamonn McCabe, Fat, GTF, Phin Manasseh, John Simmons, Theis & Khan Architects, Urban Salon, William Warren, Simon Waterfall*)

The results will be seen in an exhibition at the London College of Communication in September, during the London Design Festival.

The Foundation aims to develop the Young Design model to make it widely available.





### Next Steps

Set up a Young Design Centre to:  
house the joinedupdesignforschools exhibition  
house an exhibition about the Young Design pilot and  
provide a resource archive for developments in schools.  
The Centre will be a place of learning for everyone, a place for  
workshops, seminars, training and research.  
It will be a base for the development of the Young Design model  
over the next 2 - 3 years.
