On behalf of the North Lancashire Society of Architects and in conjunction with the University of Central Lancashire we invite you to attend our 2010 Design and Wine lecture programme.

We have an outstanding programme comprising 4 lectures covering a divergence of design topics presented by speakers of international repute.

Mark Catchlove, International Design Director of Herman Miller, opens the season on Thursday 18 February 2010 with a lecture entitled "Design for Work" – how and where we will work in 2030. Technological advancements particularly with regard to communications and sustainability have brought about a new awareness of employee needs and the psychological impact of the office environment, these are beginning to influence workplace design and it is becoming necessary to link a productive and healthy work environment with corporate strategy. Herman Miller is a problem-solving company that identify design and develop innovative solutions to support new ways of working and contribute to the effectiveness of office environments.

This is followed by a talk on 18 March 2010, relative to Preston, entitled Revival in the Square by Nick Corbett author of the book of the same name. His book with a Forward by Lord Rogers of Riverside "... provides an insight into how design strategies for new public spaces can transform our cities giving guidance on how to build public spaces that will bring people together for a positive, shared experience of urban living." We are endeavouring to get hold of exhibition material for the evening illustrating proposals for the Harris and Winckley Square, Preston. (Lecture to be confirmed)

We welcome for our April lecture one of the world's largest multidisciplinary design practices, Gensler, who will discuss and illustrate some of their outstanding international city projects including. Gensler incidentally designed the international headquarters of Herman Miller, Village Green at Chippenham providing a dynamic and innovative building boasting the latest in environmental design.

The concluding lecture - the Grenfell-Baines Memorial Lecture - will be given by Jonathan Glancey, Architecture and Design Editor of The Guardian. Jonathan is an honorary fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects. He is also the author of several books on architecture as well as a regular television and radio broadcaster who has written and presented programmes for the BBC, Channel 4 and Radio 4.
