Is it as fundamental as meaning different things by the word 'conservation'; do theory and practice lead to different solutions; does our training set us apart; is it all the government's fault; or is it simply that we don't talk to each other enough or perhaps not listen hard enough when we do?

This interactive forum will focus on the resolution of these challenges with particular reference to the imminent replacement of the PPG15.
