How to make non-domestic buildings green

How can we make sure that new and refurbished offices, schools, churches, hospitals meet the latest standards for building sustainability? What are those standards? And isn't sustainable design for buildings an irrelevant luxury at present anyway?

This conference will look at every aspect of sustainability in non-domestic buildings – including how much green features would cost and how soon they would pay for themselves.

Making even small, sustainable modifications to the design or retrofitting of non-domestic buildings can have a huge impact on the carbon footprint of the UK – and, of course, to the building owners' energy bills.

At the conference, speakers, case studies, workshops and debate will give you opportunities to explore cost-effective and up-to-date sustainable techniques, finishes and features - and how to incorporate them into building designs. At the same time, you will gain more understanding of the hard economics of green design and retrofit in all types of non-domestic buildings.

The conference's keynote speaker will be Robin Nicholson, senior director at Edward Cullinan Architects who chairs CABA's panel of specialist enablers for organisations involved in projects for buildings and spaces. He will spell out the importance of forward planning in non-domestic buildings' design and retrofit – to try to 'future-proof' our communities.
