### Fire safety design: active and passive fire protection

9:30am – 12:00pm

The government is acting following the Hackitt report and this seminar will capture the new regulatory environment post-Grenfell. With an emphasis on the RIBA Plan of Work overlay for fire, this session will cover elements of fire science and how products behave, as well as key information on passive fire protection.

**Speaker:** Wilf Butcher, Association for Specialist Fire Protection (ASFP)

Wilf has worked within the fire protection sector for over four decades, both in product manufacturing and as a consultant. In 2007, he became the CEO of the Association for Specialist Fire Protection, also representing the fire protection sector within a number of other industry bodies. Retiring in 2016, Wilf continues as an independent chair of the Construction Products Association's Technical Expert panel, and BSI committee 'Fire Safety and Built Environment'. He has also authored a foundation course in passive fire protection on behalf of the ASFP, which in cooperation with the Institution of Fire Engineers, carries a Level Three Diploma.

### Inclusive design for external built environments

This seminar will consider how the external built environment, including streets, landscaped areas, the approach to a building and the spaces between and around buildings, can be designed, built and managed to achieve an inclusive environment. The importance of ensuring safe and independent access to services and facilities for all building users will also be explored.

**Speaker:** Caroline Lewis, Access Design Solutions

Caroline is co-director of Access Design Solutions. She has provided inclusive design advice within built, pedestrian and transport environments for the past 20 years in both the UK and Australia. Qualified as a town planner, she is a member of the National Register of Access Consultants and a built environment expert at the Design Council. As a BSI and ISO committee representative, she is also recognised for her policy and standards work. Major clients have included Sydney Opera House, advising on a wayfinding strategy, and Barclays Bank regarding accessibility requirements for an assisted self-service device.
